On the cover: For a recent renovation of the top two floors of the 52-story Paul Hastings North Tower in downtown Los Angeles, a team of about 25 glaziers from Giroux Glass Inc., girouxglass.com, installed 140 large glass panels, each weighing about 800 pounds and measuring roughly 10 feet by 7 feet. The renovation of the top floors of the 1970s-era tower, which is part of the City National Plaza, required the Giroux team to use a crane to lift the large glass panes from the ground up 700 feet to the rooftop, as the freight elevator was too small to handle the load. SpyderCrane, spydercrane.com, mini cranes and other handling machines were transferred up the elevators, through an open skylight and onto the roof, where glaziers used a swing stage for glass installation. Viracon, viracon.com, fabricated the project's glass, which is low-iron Starphire Ultra-Clear glass from Vitro, vitroglazings.com. Arcadia, arcadiainc.com, fabricated the aluminum framing.
